JUDGING STANDARDS: Horticultural judging standards by Ministry of Agriculture and Food.

AOV – Any Other Variety

LEEKs: trimmed.

TOMATOES: The specimens should be typical of the cultivar, ripe, well matched, firm and free of cracks. Calyx (stem) should be intact. Small varieties must be shown as a tress.

ROOT CROPS: Should be brushed clean, not scrubbed. Top roots left on. Tops trimmed to 2.5 cm. Variety named where possible.

CUCUMBERS: Entries should be well matched specimens, over eight inches, not over ripe, straight even-shaped with blunt ends. Colour should be dark green, surface smooth or warty, according to variety. One quarter inch to stem should be on specimen. **PEPPERS:** Leave at least 2 cm of stem

PUMPKINS: Stem should be left attached but trimmed.
